The hall was set out for a Wedding reception a three course meal was provided Followed by a duo, then a disco.



- 3. MATTERS ARISING: 4.1 Maisie now has access to Box. Maisie has booked Ian Harley for New Year 2024 at a cost of £250
- 4. CORRESPONDENCE: CHAIRMAN: Claire Notley thanked Maisie and the committee for the warm welcome that they received at the Christmas party event. Ian Harley confirmed that he would be attending the New Year Event 2024. SECRETARY: Received post from Flo Gas informing members that Campingaz refill prices are increasing. Invoice from FM Tags. Reminder from Sandy to prepare items for Newsletter. TREASURER: Has received paperwork from Carole from the bank.
 RALLY SECRETARY: Letter regarding Berwick hall stating hall is £10 per hour.

 OFFICERS REPORTS: CHAIRMAN: Sadly, Peter Thripp has passed away. Condolences and a card were sent to Celia. His funeral was today, 12/12/23 and Maisie said there were a large number of East Sussex Centre members in attendance, Maisie had been asked to attend a brief meeting at Willingdon on Saturday. There is going to be a SE Region event in 2024 as the region has monies to spend.  - SECRETARY: Has received 50 printed Event Books from Bob and Sandy.

TREASURER: Michelle said she is starting to look through all the paperwork and making sense of it all. There is over £8000 in the current account, but this includes New Year. She is still waiting for T & C's from Mill Barn Farm and Yew Tree.

YOUTH: Jez said as there were very few children, he was struggling to know how to approach a Youth Treat in 2024. He talked about fundraising. Maisie confirmed that only eligible children (those who attend 8 rallies and have their cards stamped) have the cost paid for, but ALL children can attend and there is a pro ratio system for those who do less rallies.

IT Project Manager: Sarah has been adding rallies to the website but has very little information to go on so is just adding ' the bare bones'. She enquired about the holiday event but Maisie said it was too late now to add one for 2024.

NEW YEAR: 30 units booked in, all paid. the Event will run at a loss this year as Clint is expensive and there are only 65 attendees. Maisie is working out quantities and lots of the shopping has already been done. The site visit has been done. Balloons purchased and Malcolm has collected the gas. Roy asked how much can he spend on the raffle – Michelle S said £100. He has acquired some large items and will auction separately. Carole to purchase the party poppers.

- 6 **PAST EVENTS:** Christmas Party Maisie thanked Mark for the amount of time and effort he spent in the kitchen (7 hours). She said he'd done a wonderful job. There was a discussion on the flow of events as there was too much time between food courses, Father Christmas attendance, the children's events and so on.. Submissions from Sarah to check through for website. T & C's from Steve (coming through for treasurer until Michelle is signed to the banking). RALLY SECRETARY: Email forwarded from Carole regarding Fowlmere in Cambridgeshire. Steve said he was looking at it with a view to a holiday rally in 2024. Maisie said it was too late for that and to please concentrate on the 2025 rally board/holiday.

5. **OFFICERS REPORTS:** CHAIRMAN: Maisie thanked everyone who attended the New Year Rally and said it had been a 'learning curve'. YOUTH: Jez said there was not much on at the moment and not many children out. Maisie said that there were quite a few children in the centre. The committee will discuss new ways to encourage new members, but that does not ensure they will have children.

Maisie asked for some changes Plumpton/Willingdon to be swapped so that the birthday rally is at Willingdon. Also the Christmas party should be a week later. Steve will to work on it. Easter Eggs Jez will purchase once Roy confirms numbers. Onboarding Jez explained about the 'buzz word' for getting new members. Find them (Carole has on the system)/ get them onboard (Carole to send introduction to centre and summary of events/ encourage them to come out (Jez to make introductory phone calls)

The pads are out of date and will now cost £400. Decision made not to replace pads or unit but to use the map location near to the rally sites and include this in the pack for the Rally officers.
