

Fire Extinguishers

Caravanners are advised to carry a Fire Extinguisher, ideally this should be a dry powder (for LPG) and/or an Aqueous Film-Forming Foam (AFF).

Rye Bonfire


Again this proved to be a popular event at Rye College

YOUTH: The selection boxes are organised for the Christmas party and the £5 reimbursement for eligible Youth is in hand. Rally Officers must sign the attending children's card only if they attend the full weekend. A ledger will be kept to ensure everything is done correctly.


